The USGBC is the nation's leading nonprofit green building advocacy coalition, working to provide educational resources, community outreach and support of green building initiatives.

As vice-chairwoman of the USGBC's recently formed northern Colorado branch, McFaddin is the region's sole elected representative to the USGBC's statewide board.

McFaddin's term began Jan. 1, and she will be helping to promote green building programs at the legislative, community and business levels. She is the sole northern Colorado member elected to the USGBC Colorado Board.

She will assist USGBC Colorado in a number of projects, including working with the governor's office to develop incentives to promote green building, bringing nationally recognized green building speakers to USGBC workshops and conferences and statewide efforts to attract more companies committed to green building.

"It's very much an honor to join the USGBC Colorado board at a point in time when there is so much opportunity for educating the public and the building community about the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Green Building Rating System and its impact in helping to create environmentally responsible, profitable and healthy places to live and work," McFaddin said.
